<b>Course Objectives:</b>	This course prepares students to the A1 level of the Common European framework of Reference for Languages. This course is offered to students who are complete beginners in French.	
<b>Content:</b>	<p>The course builds the following communicative skills in French Students abilities at the end of the course.</p> <p><b>Listening:</b> I can recognise familiar words and very basic phrases concerning myself, my family and immediate concrete surroundings when people speak slowly and clearly.</p> <p><b>Reading:</b> I can understand familiar names, words and very simple sentences, for example on notices and posters or in catalogues.</p> <p><b>Spoken interaction:</b> I can interact in a simple way provided the other person is prepared to repeat or rephrase things at a slower rate of speech and help me formulate what I'm trying to say. I can ask and answer simple questions in areas of immediate need or on very familiar topics. Spoken production: I can use simple phrases and sentences to describe where I live and people I know.</p> <p><b>Writing:</b> I can write a short, simple postcard, for example sending holiday greetings.
