Objectives:	This course aims to familiarise students with the realities of rural India. It attempts to provide a background of agrarian studies and its growth in Indian Sociology. It tries to provide a comprehensive understanding to the students on agrarian structure and change in India particularly, under the impact of colonialism, planning and the recent neo-liberalism and the underlying conceptual and theoretical issues.	
Content:	1. Emergence of agrarian studies as a subject of Sociological inquiry, Origin and development of rural sociology in India 2. Evolution of agrarian structure in pre-colonial and colonial India: Commercialisation of Agriculture, Commodification of land and de-peasantisation 3. Agrarian Changes in post-Independent India: Land reforms, Green revolution, Agricultural productivity and regional disparity, Debate over mode of production and class differentiation in agriculture, Farmers' suicides 4. 
