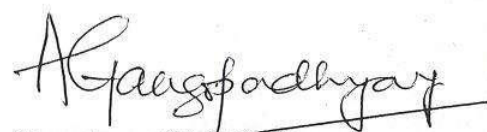

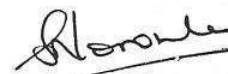

<u>Prerequisites for the course:</u>	Open to all interested in learning level I Japanese Language having completed XII th Std.	
<u>Objective:</u>	In the A1 Kutsudo course the students learn Japanese language through activities. Katsudo means activities in Japanese. The focus of the course is to make students more familiar with day to day conversations and related vocabulary. Since reading and writing practice is taken care in the course A2 (Rikai), here in A1 more importance is given to understanding conversations and to learn new vocabularies and basic grammar of the Japanese language. Hence tests are conducted in the form of interviews rather than conducting written test. The session 23 gives the students a chance to interact and try to communicate with native Japanese speaking students from Nihon University. An additional native Japanese support lecturer from Tokyo will be present during sessions 14 to 22 to make the course more interactive and get experience starting basic conversations with Japanese natives. This will also help students to compare and learn the accent and intonations of several Japanese language speakers

<u>Prerequisites for the course:</u>	Open to all interested in learning level II Japanese Language having completed XII th Std. and Japanese Language (Beginners Level -I)	
<u>Objective:</u>	Learn to read and write Hiragana and Katakana native Japanese characters. Introduce the student to basic Japanese words and vocabulary. In lesson 1 and lesson 2 the students learn the Hiragana and Katakana characters, their phonetics and writing methods. Through the lessons 3 to 14 the students practice reading and understand the meanings of several new vocabulary used in day to day conversations. The periodical test in session 3,5,13 and 25 enable to systematically evaluate the progress made by the students in learning the language. Based on test outcomes the students are counselled and advised on an individual basis that which areas they should focus, put additional practice to improve their proficiency in the language.

Updates on Japanese Certificate of Proficiency – A1 Course

Course Funding Agency: Japan Foundation New Delhi

Start of the Course

The Japanese Certificate of Proficiency A1 course was started in Goa University from 11th of February 2020 with support from Japan Foundation New Delhi (JFND). The course was conducted by the Department of International Relations of the Goa University. The course instructor was trained at Japan Foundation New Delhi in January 2020 for a period of 1 week on the new generation JF Marugoto Text Book for the course.

Covid Lockdowns & Delays

The course was initially started as in-classroom sessions in Goa University campus from February 11th till 15th March 2020 for a period of 5 weeks. However due to COVID lockdowns the course had to be stopped after 15th March 2020 without clarity on when we can restart the course.

Successful adaptation to Online Classes

When we were not getting clarity on when the University will reopen, we experimented online classes. After several trials we adapted the course successfully in to an online course and we re-started the course from May 19th 2020.

Successful completion of 1st batch of students

From May 19th 2020 the course continued online and we successfully completed the first batch of the course on 17th January 2021. We received excellent positive feedback from the first batch students about the course and also the way the course was adapted swiftly in to an online course. As the course was conducted online for majority of the time, the students were able to attend the classes even when they were travelling for work or personal reasons to outside Goa. Hence we got an excellent attendance from the students. Also course was conducted without any interruptions during further lockdowns.

Start of the 2nd batch of the Course

Due to the above said reasons and as well as foreseeing any further lockdowns, the second batch of the Japanese course was also decided to be conducted online. We also conducted an opinion poll among the prospective students to see their needs for the course which turned out to be favouring online course. The second batch was started from 17th November 2021 and is expected to be completed in the month of October 2022. The course is presently being conducted by the School of International and Area Studies (SIAS) of Goa University.

Thanks to Japan Foundation & Future of the course

We thank Japan Foundation for funding this course for the past 2 years (2 batches). We look forward to continue the Japanese Language course at Goa University for the people of Goa who love to learn the language and culture of Japan. We hope this course will foster further strengthening of the relationship between India and Japan.
