Title of the Course: Certificate of Proficiency in Japanese Language Level Elementary 1- A2 Part-1 (Katsudoo)

Effective from AY: 2021-2022

Prerequisites for the course:

Open to all interested in learning Japanese Language and acquiring a certificate of proficiency. Japanese Certificate of Proficiency A-1 or School Level Certificate-Equivalent is required. Minimum qualification - Higher Secondary (Std.XII) examination conducted by the Goa State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or of any other Board recognized by Goa University as its equivalent.

Objective:

This course is intended for students who have basic level Japanese knowledge (Japanese A1 Certified) and wants to further continue improving their Japanese language proficiency. Students should be already fluent in reading and writing Hiragana, Katakana characters and basic Kanji characters. In this level of the course Elementary 1-A2 Part-1 the students gain practical ability to communicate in everyday situations. A lot of emphasis will be placed on practicing listening and speaking Japanese in the class. The lessons are based on context and situations which students will face when interacting with Japanese nationals while living abroad or while living and travelling in Japan. This course offers learning in both language and culture. The course helps to deepen intercultural understanding by learning Japanese culture and reflecting on the students own culture in the city or country where they are from.

The students who take this course are advised to continue and complete the Part-2 of the course named Elementary 1-A2 Part-2 (Rikai). This course is based on JF Standard for Japanese Language Education.

Updates on Japanese Certificate of Proficiency – A1 Course

Start of the Course

The Japanese Certificate of Proficiency A1 course was started in Goa University from 11th of February 2020 with support from Japan Foundation New Delhi (JFND). The course was conducted by the Department of International Relations of the Goa University. The course instructor was trained at Japan Foundation New Delhi in January 2020 for a period of 1 week on the new generation JF Marugoto Text Book for the course.

Covid Lockdowns & Delays

The course was initially started as in-classroom sessions in Goa University campus from February 11th till 15th March 2020 for a period of 5 weeks. However due to COVID lockdowns the course had to be stopped after 15th March 2020 without clarity on when we can restart the course.

Successful adaptation to Online Classes

When we were not getting clarity on when the University will reopen, we experimented online classes. After several trials we adapted the course successfully in to an online course and we re-started the course from May 19th 2020.

Successful completion of 1st batch of students

From May 19th 2020 the course continued online and we successfully completed the first batch of the course on 17th January 2021. We received excellent positive feedback from the first batch students about the course and also the way the course was adapted swiftly in to an online course. As the course was conducted online for majority of the time, the students were able to attend the classes even when they were travelling for work or personal reasons to outside Goa. Hence we got an excellent attendance from the students. Also course was conducted without any interruptions during further lockdowns.

Start of the 2nd batch of the Course

Due to the above said reasons and as well as foreseeing any further lockdowns, the second batch of the Japanese course was also decided to be conducted online. We also conducted an opinion poll among the prospective students to see their needs for the course which turned out to be favouring online course. The second batch was started from 17th November 2021 and is expected to be completed in the month of October 2022. The course is presently being conducted by the School of International and Area Studies (SIAS) of Goa University.

Thanks to Japan Foundation & Future of the course

We thank Japan Foundation for funding this course for the past 2 years (2 batches). We look forward to continue the Japanese Language course at Goa University for the people of Goa who love to learn the language and culture of Japan. We hope this course will foster further strengthening of the relationship between India and Japan.
