She has led pilot, acceptability and feasibility studies, cluster randomized control traials as well as scaling-up programs on adolescent health and well being. She has contributed to book Chapter, Journal articles and presented conference papers on adolescent and young people's health. She has experience of working with national and stage governments, national and international NGO's grassroots organianisations and wide range of stakeholders on programme development, training and implementation. She has worked with various types of school systems, intervention delivery agents in different parts of India and with different target groups. She also serves on the Counselling cell of the GEDC, Govt. of Goa. She also works with issues such as child protection and family/domestic violesnce. She has served the Juvenile Justice Board, under the Juvenile Justice Care and Prtection amendment Act, 2015.

Key points discussed

What is counselling and assuring confidentiality, the need of it, importance of effective communication(can be used in day to day interactions as well), what should be avoided while counselling, self awareness in terms of beliefs, values, attitudes and judgments which mght influence the counselling process, skills required in counselling process (rapport building, questions and probes, paraphrasing / mirroring, clarifying, positive asset search, summarizing.

The session ended with a vote of thanks delivered by Neelay Gunaji part-I MSW student. A memento was presented to the speaker.




Figure 1 Group Picture
