The New Economic Policy (NEP) initiated in the early nineties gave a turning point to the economy by opening up to foreign competition and integrating itself with the Global Economy. India experienced marked and sustained high economic growth in the post-liberalization period which helped uplift millions of people but if poverty India needs sustained change in the next past, with more emphasis on improving quality of growth. India's economy continues to face one of the fastest growing economies in the world in recent years. India also emerged as an important player in the global politics, economy and technology arena. As young population and a burgeoning middle class act as a driver of economic growth and growth spurs, technical and managerial human resources for the global economy. The large educated, skilled workforce can contribute to the global manufacturing of goods and services and emerges a global class in the global economy. The Indian Economy has already emerged as the global hub of emerging services such as pharmaceuticals, chemicals, software, gems, and jewelry.</p> <p>The seminar is designed to create an informed discussion about the developmental challenges faced by India and generate the consensus of approaches in creating second employment and poverty reduction. 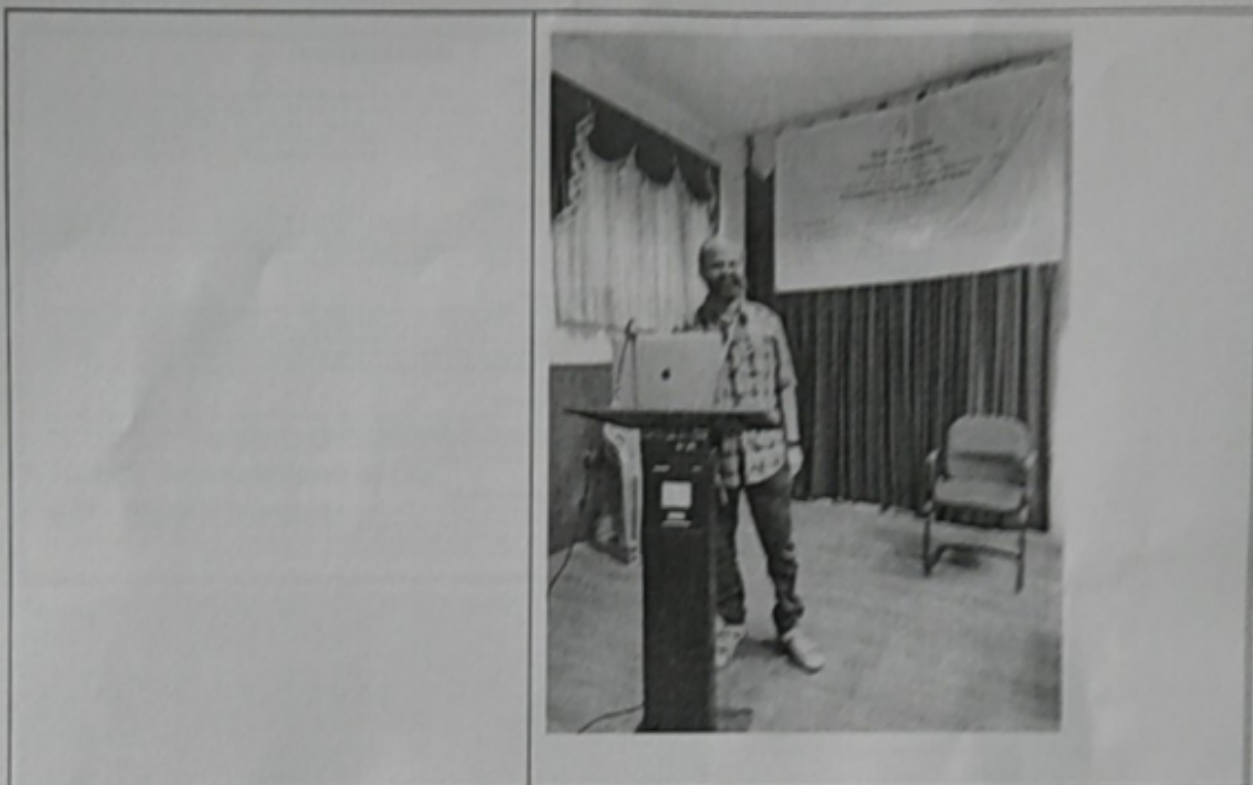


## Prof. Rudragouda K. Biradar
