

### Report

Training Programme on **Gender, Work and Development** jointly organized by the Department of Women's Studies, Goa University and V.V Giri National Labour Institute, Noida, Uttar Pradesh

5 May -10 May 2019

Venue-Goa University

The Department of Women's Studies in collaboration with V. V. Giri National Labour Institute organized a Training Programme on 'Gender, Work and Development' – a training and capacity building programme at Goa University from 6<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> May 2018. The programme was the first of a kind to be organized in collaboration by the department.

Scheduled for a whole day the training workshop saw a range of multi faceted topics that was discussed and explained in 4 different sessions in 4 different days namely: Gender, Work & Development, Skill Development, Awareness & Capacity Building and Women & Economic Development. The Coordinator from the V. V. Giri Institute Mr. Amitav Khuntia spoke on a number of topics for 2 days on various topics dealing with Gender Equality for Decent work, Good Practices in work, providing course materials on various schemes, projects & institutes etc. Mr. Khuntia also spoke on the emergence of Gender Sensitivity in work places and various Laws in place that provides in safeguarding labor rights.

The Training Programme also saw a presentation by Dr. Jennifer Kamat on developing entrepreneurship skills among women which showcase different kinds of skills and marketing programmes conducted by her. It exhibited the various project plans and funding that uplifted the tribal communities' culture and food by providing proper equipments and entrepreneurship skills. The session was widely praised for its innovative ideas and development success which took place.

The training programme also saw a session conducted by Adv. Coraline Colasso on the topic 'Laws Related to Gender & Work' which extensively spoke about the Sexual Harassment at Workplace Act, 2013. She explained the various

objectionable acts that can be a sexual offence under the Act and how we all need to focus on creating a workplace free from sexism and misogynistic values. The other session saw Mr. Ateequr Rehman conducting his session on 'Team Building, Community Mobilization and Leadership Development' where he conducted many activities that taught the participants of building a cordial and supportive relationship in an organization for better performance. The session witnessed an over enthusiastic participation by all the participants for its witty and effective activities.

On the 4<sup>th</sup> day of the training programme the participants were taken for a field visit to a Handloom Textile based in Corgao, Pernem. There the participants saw different kind of materials at display like Sarees, bedsheets which were all hand made by the staff of the textile. The last day of the training programme had Panel Discussion on 'Tourism and Work Opportunity for Women in Goa' which had Prof. M. S. Dayanand, Adv. Albertina Almeida & Dr. Nishtha Desai as panelists who spoke on the various dimensions of tourism that had an everlasting in Goa's Economy and Social Life. The discussion saw questions from the participants which critiqued the existing tourism related policies of the state.



The Training Programme ended with a Valedictory Function which saw the presense of Prof. Rahul Tripathi as Chief Guest accompanied by Prof. Shaila Desouza and Mr. Amitav Khuntia. The participants consisting of Students/scholars from undergraduate, postgraduate, MPhil, PhD); developmental professionals, Govt. servants. and practitioners working on women's issues gave their feedback of the training programme and congratulated the department for

organizing it effectively. The Coordinator of this Programme Dr. Mamta Kumari was particularly praised by the Head of the Department, Prof. Shaila Desouza for taking the charge of organizing it despite of the short deadlines it experienced. At the end Mr. Khuntia expressed his gratitude to the department for hosting it successfully and expressed of having more such collaborations in the near future. The Chief Guest Prof. Rahul Tripathi congratulated the department and handed out the certificates to the participants.
