

Museum Facility of Zoology Discipline:

The museum maintains a wide variety of specimens collection belonging to different invertebrates to vertebrate phyla. The animal specimens from the museum are used by the students for detailed taxonomical studies. Major specimen collections in the museum incorporate representations of almost all phyla.

A few Microscopic organisms, along with various cytological and histological collection of permanent slides, is also maintained and utilized as and when required for teaching-learning and research purpose. Specimens deposited by persons from the road kill are also entered into the museum collection for their storage upon verification. Besides this, we also have a good collection of skeletal structures and anatomical models of various vertebrates.

A substantial collection of entomological specimens of Butterflies and Insects through dry preservation techniques is also a special attraction of our museum. Most of these collections represent the specimens that were collected by our own M. Sc. Students during their teaching/learning process and to promote research in the area of biodiversity and entomology. Constraints of the space availability do not allow us to display the full collection at a time but otherwise, we do have a workbench to do the needful display as and when one wants to refer to our museum collection.
