6. Detail of the Resource Person (Brief biodata)	Dr. Amit Dias completed his MD in Preventive and Social Medicine from Goa Medical College. He currently serves as faculty in the Department of Preventive and Social Medicine at Goa Medical College (GMC) where he has been teaching students for the last two decades. He was awarded the Caiteano Dias fellowship to complete his Post Graduate Diploma in Geriatric Medicine at the MS Ramya Medical College in Bangalore. He also completed his Diploma in Tropical Medicine and the MSc in Clinical Trials from the prestigious London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, UK. He has several research papers in National and International scientific journals and has			

written chapters in several books. He was invited by the World Health Organisation to draft the guidelines for the G7 Health Minister's meeting in Kobe, Japan.

In addition to his core duties at Goa Medical College, he has been involved with a lot of social service activities, especially for the elderly in the area of Alzheimer's disease. He was awarded by the State Government on Goa Liberation Day 2018 for his contribution to Society. His work in the area of Alzheimer's disease has been recognized internationally and he has recently co-authored the Lancet paper on the prevention of dementia and Alzheimer's disease which changed the focus of management on the prevention of Alzheimer's disease. He was part of the Lancet commission on the Prevention of dementia. He is part of the guideline development group for dementia risk reduction for the WHO and also part of the Integrated Care of the Older People (ICOPE Initiative) of the WHO. He was one of the authors of the Dementia India report that was presented to the Government of India. He is the only Indian to have won the prestigious Foundation Médéric Alzheimer and the Alzheimer Disease International prize for being the best evidence-based psychosocial research for people with dementia. Dr. Dias is the founder secretary of the Dementia Society of Goa and the coordinator of the 10/66 Dementia Research consortium in India. He is also a member of the Global Consortium for the Prevention of Depression. He was the honourary Chairperson of Sangath an internationally acclaimed NGO working in the area of Mental Health. He recently published his research providing evidence that Depression can be prevented in the elderly (Depression in Late Life -DIL Project) in the Journal of American Medical Association (JAMA).

He is the recipient of several fellowships and awards. He has been doing several research projects for the benefit of improving Public Health, on a range of health

	conditions affecting the nervous system such as rabies, Japanese encephalitis, iodine deficiency disorders, polio, depression, and dementia. He also has done research on Thalassemia, Rheumatic heart disease, and diabetes in the state of Goa. He has also done a lot of research and is interested in the area of spiritual medicine and health. He also conducted several operational research projects on COVID-19 and its impact on the people.				
	He believes that the medical profession is a mission and an opportunity to make a difference in the community. He firmly believes that if we have to improve Public health we need to be creative, and innovative and develop better leadership skills.

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
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
