After you have completed the Intent to Enroll form, you will have access to pay the non-refundable admission deposit of \$700 online. Your deposit is due on May 13, 2021. This deposit is applied to your first tuition payment.

Pay your deposit through the link on your status page, which becomes available after you complete the Intent to Enroll form. International payments are made through Flywire, and will take 48 hours to process and reflect on your account.

Should we not receive your deposit by the deadline noted above, your admission may be withdrawn.
